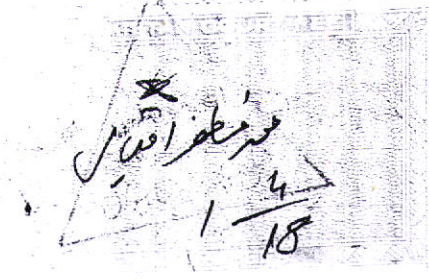

REPRESENTATION UNDER RULE 12 OF THE
ELECTION RULES 2017 READ WITH SECTIONS 21
AND 22 OF THE ELECTIONS ACT, 2017

Respectfully submitted,

1. That consequent upon the public notice issued by the esteemed Election Commission of Pakistan inviting objections with regard to the publication of draft national and provincial constituencies, I, Muhammad Muzaffar Iqbal son of Manzoor Ahmad, resident of Mohallah Pir Karyan Opposite Jamia Masjid Tayyaba, Street No. 3 Pakpattan Sharif, ID Card No. 36402-9439224-9, a voter of Mohallah Pir Karyan, 4-Municipal Committee Pakpattan Sharif, Block Code 210100405 and Serial No. 165, presently performing as Chairman, Municipal Committee Pakpattan Sharif have reservations on the draft as published by the Election Commission of Pakistan and I hereby tender my reservation with regard thereto:

i. While starting with the same, it may be stated that Pakpattan Sharif District has been subdivided into five provincial constituencies with the number of votes mentioned against each:

PP 191	3,62,626
PP 192	3,51,886
PP193	3,59,036
PP194	3,76,763
PP195	3,73,376

It may very delightfully be opined that the humble representationist has no objection with regard to the draft constituencies bearing Nos. 193, 194 and 195. Similarly Pakpattan District has been subdivided into two national constituencies comprising of NA145 Pakpattan-I with population of 9,11,655 and NA 146 Pakpattan-II consisting of 9,11,432 populace pertaining to Arifwala. The humble representationist also don't have any objection with regard to formation of these constituencies.

ii. However, the humble representationist has reservations and objections with regard to PP191 and PP192 in the following terms:

iii. Before embarking upon the reservations, it may be stated that three maps have been appended with the representation. The break up thereof is as follows:

A. The one published with the draft constituencies, attached as **Annex - "A"**.

B. The former formation of constituencies relevant to the past, is attached as **Annex - "B"**.

C. The map depicting the proposed amendments is attached as **Annex - "C"**.

D. Population Census Report 2017, District Pakpattan Sharif is enclosed as **Annex - "D"**.

2. Constituency PP191

Pakpattan 1 qanoongoi circle is part of this constituency and Behram Pur is also a constituent of this qanoongoi but the major portion of this qanoongoi falls within the limitations of PP192. It is state worthy that Behrma Pur patwar circle consists upon 6 villages/ مواضع

- i. Behram Pur
- ii. Lal Khan Dhuddi
- iii. Killi
- iv. Jatto Wal
- v. Shahoo Baloch
- vi. Jawaya Mall

It is embarrassing that five villages excluding Jawaya Mall as per the map, Annex - A has been included in PP192 whereas Jawaya Mall, a part of this patwar circle consisting of 926 populace has been included in PP191. This anomaly deserves resolution and it should be included in PP192 where it had remained a part of the constituency in the long lost past. Its populace is 12,621. Needless to emphasize that Behram Pur is contiguous and very close to the city area rather a very imperative part thereof and its disintegration can cause inconvenience to the dwellers of that area. It is further added that while working as Chairman, Municipal Committee, it has been observed that water supply and the sewerage drainage for this area are the responsibility of Municipal Committee Pakpattan, hence it would be more appropriate that it should be allowed to remain a part of PP192. It may further be added that Behram Pur is a part of qanoongoi circle Pakpattan-I alongwith city population.

3. That in Annex - C the territory depicted in Orange colour, stands included in Pakpattan City but one patwar circle has been detached. It is surprising that according to the details, this area stands included in PP191 with its populace as 12,621 and existing in PP191 whereas it should have in PP192, being very close and integrated with city limits of Pakpattan Sharif.
4. That there is another anomaly in the map Annex - A that Pakpattan dehati has been depicted in the limits of PP191 whereas according to the details provided with the publication, it has been included in PP192. This anomaly also resolves deletion.

5. That the area depicted in Pink colour has been depicted in PP191 according to Annex - A, but according to the details, the impugned area has been attached with the city urban area and a part of PP192. This confusion also deserves revocation.

6. That two patwar circles Ferozpur Chishtian having populace of 6,020 and Mauza Marri Amb are located alongwith the River Sutluj and somewhere the lands of these patwar circles fall on the southern bank of River Sutluj divided by the said river. The limits of existing PP191 also touch these patwar circles. It would be very appropriate and in the best interest of locales of that vicinity that both these patwar circles are included in PP191. The territory of these both patwar circles, having populace of 10,152, has been depicted in Yellow colour in Annex- C which would justify the opinion and representation of humble representationist.

It shall be more appropriate that the comparison of the populace of Behram Pur worth 12,621 and Feroz Pur Chishtian 6,020 and Marri Amb, 4,132 be described here for confrontation and at the gross comparison, it may be depicted as follows:

6-A. Population of PP191

Total populace for this constituency is 3,62,626. After excluding populace of Behram Pur (12,621), it comes to 3,50,005, and after inclusion of Ferozpur Chistian and Marri Amb (10,152), its total would raise upto 3,60,157 which remains almost the same already allocated to PP191.

6-B. Population of PP192

That with respect to PP192, its total populace is 3,51,886 has been depicted in the proposal and after inclusion of Behram Pur (12,621), its total raises upto 3,64,507 and after exclusion of 10,152 of proposed

Ferozpur Chishtian and Marri Amb, it remains 3,54,355, almost with the original populace allocated to this constituency.

7. That by acceptance of the above stated proposals and reservations, there is no personal gain or benefit to the humble representationist but it shall be for the benefit and convenience of the Public at Large which is the intent of the Constitution and the Legislation.
8. That if given a chance, the humble representationist can also appear in person and assist the worthy Election Commission of Pakistan to reach at a just conclusion.
